



Where is George Palmer?

WHEREAS by a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a cause Read versus Palmer, it was, amongst other things, referred to James William Farrer, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, to enquire and state to the said Court whether George Palmer is living or dead, and, if dead, when and where he died;

The said George Palmer, if living, is, by his Solicitor, on or before the 8th day of December 1848, to come in and claim the benefit of the said Decree before the said Master, at his chambers, in Southampton Buildings, Chancery Lane, London, or in default thereof he will be peremptorily excluded therefrom.

The said George Palmer, in the year 1824, intermarried with Harriet Read, of Aldbourne, in the county of Wilts,' and for a short time after his said marriage lived with his said wife, first at Eastbury, in the county of Berks, and afterwards in the parish of Aldbourne aforesaid, but has not since been heard of (except in the year 1827); therefore, if any person or persons can state whether the said George Palmer is living or dead, and, if living, where he is to be found, and, if dead, when and where he died, he or they are requested to give such information to Messrs. Rowland and Son, Solicitors, Ramsbury, Wilts, or to Mr. William Lewis, No. 6, Raymond-buildings, Gray's-inn
