
ROLL OF HONOUR

ALBERY, CHARLES ERNEST - Private 201813 - 1st/4th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - Died 2nd November 1917 in Egypt - Age 24 - Born in Rochester, Kent; Resident of Whaddon, Alderbury; Enlisted at Trowbridge; Son of Charles Albery of New Brompton, Kent; Husband of Annie Albery formerly Dummer of Cocking, Sussex - Buried at Gaza War Cemetery, Israel - Grave/Memorial Reference - XIII. C. 8. - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on a Memorial Headstone in St. Mary's Churchyard, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

BEAVEN/BEVAN, CHARLES HAZEL - Driver 173546 - Base Details, Royal Engineers - Died 1st February 1917 of pneumonia - Age 26 - born in Salisbury; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Whaddon, Alderbury; Son of Mr & Mrs. C. Beavan; Husband of Mable Etta Beavan of Whaddon, Alderbury - Buried at Salonika (Lembet Road) Military Cemetery, Salonika, Greece - Grave/Memorial Reference:- 793. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

BUNDY, ARTHUR CECIL - Private 150829 - 1st Canadian Mounted Rifles Battalion - Died 15th September 1916 - Age 23 - Son of Mrs. Evelyn Bundy of Silver Street, Alderbury; Brother of Ernest N. Bundy who also gave his life for his country - Buried at Serre Road Cemetery No. 1., Serre, Pas de Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - VII. E. 10. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

BUNDY, ERNEST N. - Private 114142 - 1st Canadian Mounted Rifles Battalion - Died 5th June 1916 - Age 20 - Son of Mrs. Evelyn Bundy of Silver Street, Alderbury; Brother of Arthur Cecil Bundy who also gave his life for his country - Buried at Railway Dugouts Burial Ground, leper, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference - II. B. 12. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

BUNDY, ROBERT HENRY - Private 43330 - 1st Battalion Hampshire Regiment - Died 22nd April 1918 - Age 19 - Born in Alderbury; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Alderbury; Son of Robert and Ellen Bundy of Littleton, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Loos Memorial, Pas de Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 73. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

BUNDY, THOMAS - Private 10316 - 2nd Battalion Machine Gun Corps (Infantry) - Died 18th December 1916 of wounds - Age 28 - Born in Alderbury; Enlisted at Salisbury; Son of Robert Bundy of Alderbury; Husband of Mrs. W. A. Bundy of Lynwood Cottage, Laverstock - Buried at Bazentin-Le-Petit Military Cemetery, Somme, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - C. 3. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

BUNDY, WALTER JOSHUA - Sergeant 144228 - 13th Battalion Canadian Infantry (Quebec Regiment) - Died 5th June 1917 - Age 25 - Son of Samuel and Charlotte Elizabeth Bundy of Alderbury - Buried at Lapugnoy Military Cemetery, Pas de Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - IV. C. 9. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

EARNEY, EDWARD THOMAS - Private 202999 - 1st/4th Battalion Dorsetshire Regiment - Died 2nd March 1919 - Age 24 - Son of William and Phoebe Earney of Alderbury - Buried at Alderbury (St. Mary) Churchyard, Alderbury - Grave/Memorial Reference - Near South East corner of church. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

HARPER, FRANCIS (FRANK) GEORGE - Private 203065 - 2nd Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - Died 31st July 1917 - Born in Amesbury; Resident of Alderbury; Enlisted at Salisbury - Buried at Hooge Crater Cemetery, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium - Grave/Memorial Reference:- XIII. F. 13. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

HATCHER, EDWARD - Private 1321 - 1st Battalion Welsh Guards - Died 9th October 1916 - Born in Appleshaw, Hampshire; Enlisted in Brecon, Brecknockshire - Buried at London Cemetery and Extension, Longueval, Somme, France - Grave/Memorial Reference:- 9 E. 21 - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on a Memorial Headstone in St. Mary's Churchyard, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

HATCHER, ERNEST H. - Private 202197 - 2nd/4th Battalion Dorsetshire Regiment - Died 3rd November 1917 - Age 28 - Born in Alderbury; Enlisted at Salisbury; Son of Samuel and Althea Hatcher of Alderbury; Husband of Ellen Durnford Hatcher of 28 Milford Hill, Salisbury - Buried at Gaza War Cemetery, Israel - Grave/Memorial Reference - XXXII. E. 9. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury

HATCHER, FREDERICK CHARLES - Able Seaman R/5495 - Hawke Battalion, Royal Naval Division, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve - Died 21st March 1918 - Age 20 - Son of Arthur and Laura Hatcher of Alderbury Bridge, Salisbury - Commemorated on the Arras Memorial, Pas de Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - Bay 1. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury

HATCHER, JOHN PHILIP - Private 18919 - 1st Battalion Hampshire Regiment - Died 20th December 1916 - Born in Andover, Hampshire; Enlisted at Birmingham; Resident of Salisbury - Buried at Sailly-Saillisel British Cemetery, Somme, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - VI. H. 3. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on a Memorial Headstone in St.

Mary's Churchyard, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury-Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury



HAZEL, SIDNEY/SYDNEY - Ordinary Seaman J/31460 - Royal Navy aboard H.M.S. Hampshire which was commissioned to convey Lord Kitchener for talks with Russian Military leaders in Russia. The vessel hit a mine between Marwick Head and the Brough of Birsay and most of its complement of 655 were lost as was Lord Kitchener and his staff - Died 5th June 1916 - Age 18 - Enlisted June 1914 - Son of William John and Alice Ann Hazel of The Ferry Cottage, Chute End, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Portsmouth Naval Memorial, The Esplanade, Southsea, Portsmouth, Hampshire - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 14. - Commemorated on the H.M.S. Hampshire Memorial and in the Book of Remembrance in Winchester Cathedral, Winchester, Hampshire. - Commemorated on the H.M.S. Hampshire Memorial Wall, Kitchener Monument,

G. 1. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

INGRAM, WILLIAM - Able Seaman London Z/181 - Drake Battalion, Royal Naval Division, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve - Died 4th February 1917 - Age 24 - Son of George and Anna Ingram of 18 Southampton Road, Salisbury - Commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme France - Grave/Memorial Reference: - Pier and Face 1 A. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

KERLEY/KERLY, MAURICE ADOLPHUS - Private 38712 - 7th Battalion Prince Albert's (Somerset Light Infantry) - Died 6th July 1918 of wounds - Born in Barford St. Martin; Enlisted at Salisbury - Buried at Cronenbourg French National Cemetery, Bas-Rhin, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - Allied. 3. 121. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury (Originally inscribed as Arthur Kerly)

MOULAND, EDGAR - Private 651 - 12th Battalion Australian Infantry, Australian Imperial Forces - Died 25th April 1915 - Age 27 - Born in Alderbury; Son of Emma and the late John Mouland of Dudley House, Nether Wallop, Stockbridge, Hampshire; formerly of the Forge, The Green, Alderbury where John Mouland was the blacksmith; Brother of Wilfred Mouland who also gave his life for his country - Buried at Lone Pine Cemetery, Anzac, Turkey - Grave/Memorial Reference - O. 12. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated on a Memorial Headstone in St. Mary's Churchyard, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

MOULAND, WILFRED - Private 151074 - 1st Canadian Mounted Rifles Battalion - Died Between 7th and 10th April 1917 - Age 23 - Son of Emma and the late John Mouland of Dudley House, Nether Wallop, Stockbridge, Hampshire; formerly of the Forge, The Green, Alderbury where John Mouland was the blacksmith; Brother of Edgar Mouland who also gave his life for his country - Buried at Cabaret-Rouge British Cemetery, Souchez, Pas de Calais, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - XIV. M. 2. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

MUSSELWHITE, **HARRY** - Company Sergeant Major 4975 - 7th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - Died 29th April 1918 at home of wounds - Born in Langford; Resident of Burlesdon, Southampton; Enlisted

at Devizes - Buried at Alderbury (St. Mary) Churchyard, Alderbury - Grave/Memorial Reference:- Near North West Corner of Church.

NORTHEAST, ALBERT - Private 22080 - C Company, 2nd Battalion Royal Warwickshire Regiment - Died 3rd August 1918 - Age 38 - Born in Alderbury; Enlisted at London; Resident of Islington, London; Son of Edward and Jane Northeast of Alderbury - Buried at Boscon British Cemetery, Italy - Plot 2. Row A. Grave 8. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

NORTHEAST, LESLIE LEONARD - Private 34291 - 1st Battalion Dorsetshire Regiment - Died 11th August 1918 - Born in Alderbury; Enlisted at Devizes; Resident of Alderbury; Son of Charles George and Agnes Northeast - Buried at Bouchoir New British Cemetery, Somme, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - IV. D. 100. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

PREWETT, HARRY - Private 9463 - 5th Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment) - Died 29th March 1917 - Age 23 - Born in Alderbury; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Alderbury; Son of Henry James Prewett of Southampton Road, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Basra Memorial, Iraq - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 30 and 64. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

ROLLS, HEDLEY ROBERT - Private 9694 - 5th Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment) - Died 21st December 1918 - Age 33 - Born in Alderbury; Enlisted at Salisbury; Resident of Alderbury; Son of Mr. George Rolls of Vicarage Road, Alderbury; Brother of Reynold George Rolls who also gave his life for his country - Buried at Baghdad (North Gate) War Cemetery, Iraq - Grave/Memorial Reference - IV. E. 9. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

ROLLS, REYNOLD GEORGE - Private 9288 - 6th (Wiltshire Yeomanry) Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment) - Died 7th November 1918 - Born in Alderbury; Enlisted at Devizes; Resident of Alderbury; Son of George Rolls of Vicarage Road, Alderbury; Brother of Hedley Robert Rolls who also gave his life for his country - Buried at Cologne Southern Cemetery, Cologne, Nordrhein-Westfal, Germany - Grave/Memorial Reference - V. H. 3. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

SIMS, HENRY JOHN - Private 29189 - A Company, 6th Battalion, Somerset Light Infantry - Died 21st March 1918 - Age 19 - Born in Westbury; Enlisted at Bristol; Son of Harry and Emma Sims, of the Police Station, Eastcott Road, Swindon - Commemorated on the Pozieres Memorial, Somme, France - Grave/Memorial Reference:- Panel 25 and 26 - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury

TOZER, HUGH HENRY - Private 65046 - 2nd/6th Battalion (Territorials), Devonshire Regiment - Died 22nd November 1917 - Age 20 - Born in Salisbury; Enlisted at Salisbury; Son of Thomas William and Annie Meaby Tozer of Whaddon Farm, Alderbury; Served in India with the 2nd/4th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - Buried at Amara War Cemetery, Iraq - Grave/Memorial Reference - XII. H. 10. - Commemorated on the St. Mary's Church Roll of Honour, Alderbury - Commemorated on the Village War Memorial, Alderbury - Commemorated in the Diocese of Salisbury Memorial Book, St. Thomas Church, Salisbury
