Letter to the Editor

Sir,

A paragraph having appeared in a Wilts Tory paper, on Saturday week last, containing a gross calumny on the private character of the Earl of Radnor as a Landlord, and which was not seen by the majority of his Lordship's Tenants and scarcely known to many of them, till replied to in the Salisbury Journal of last Monday: we, the undersigned, disclaiming all party-feeling, think we should be wanting in the common dictates of humanity as men, and in duty to the Earl of Radnor as tenants, if we suffered the present opportunity to pass unnoticed.
