

# Post Office Directory Extract 1855





**Alderbury** - is a township and parish giving name to the Hundred and Union in which it is situated, in South Wilts, 3 miles south-east from Salisbury, 5 south-west from West Dean station, and 93 miles from London, on the Southampton canal, containing in 1851 (including the chapelries of Farley & Pitton), 1,438 inhabitants of whom 742 were in the township or Alderbury; with 2,157 acres. The living is a vicarage in the archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury, and patronage of the Treasurer of Salisbury Cathedral; the incumbent is the Rev. Newton Smart, M.A. The church of the Virgin Mary is a small plain structure, situated on an eminence. Alderbury House is the seat of G. Fort, Esq.

**Post Office -** John Lewis, receiver, Alderbury. Letters arrive from Salisbury at  $\frac{1}{4}$  before 8 a.m. and are dispatched at  $\frac{1}{2}$  past 5 p.m. The nearly money order office is at Salisbury

Post Office - David Parsons, receiver, Farley. Letters arrive from Salisbury at ½ past 9 a.m. and are dispatched at 4 p.m.

National School - George Burden, master; Mrs. Mary Frost, mistress

At **Farley** is an hospital for six poor men and as many aged women, founded by Sir Stephen Fox in 1688. This place is a chapelry and township, 4 miles east of Salisbury, near the Salisbury railway and canal, with a population of 286. Hinnock is a farm.

Pitton is a chapelry and township, with 410 inhabitants, 3 miles north-east of Salisbury.

**Clarendon** is an extra parochial liberty, about a mile eastward from Alderbury, with 187 habitants. Here formerly stood a royal palace, which was a frequent residence of the English kings, and was visited by Queen Elizabeth. Henry II assembled a parliament here in 1163, which enacted the celebrated "Constitutions of Clarendon", to restrain the encroachments of the Court of Rome. The only remains of the palace are part of a wall overgrown with ivy. About a mile from the ruins is Clarendon Lodge, the seat of Sir. F. Bathurst, Bart. Near it formerly stood an Augustine priory, founded by Henry II

Waddon is a hamlet, 1 mile south-east from Alderbury.

At Ivy Church is an academy.
