1660		Be it remembered that Henry Kinninmond, Rector of Allcannings did (according to the law in that case provided) read the 39 Articles of the Church of England in due season, and did give his assent to each Article distinctly within 1 month after his institution into the sayd Rectorie of Allcannings. Robt. Nicholas, Wm. Fowle, 4 May 1669. Bee it remembered that Henry Kinninmond, Rector of Allcannings, did order his servant, Robert Bartlet, to put fower coves into the pasture grounds of the farm' and that the sayd Robert Bartlet did actually put to depasture his masters coves in every pasture ground where the farmer doth ususally put his coves to depasture, except the ground called (thow) lands, this was done the day and year above written in the presence of us whose names are under written. Daniell Maslin, Jeffery Pottenger (his mark), Edward Dike, churchwardens. (this appears in the register at the end of 1685 burials.)
