Alton Barnes

Alton Barnes - is a township, parish, and small village, adjoining Alton Priors, in the Swanborough Hundred, Union and division of Devizes, South Wilts, and diocese of Sarum, situate near the Kennet and Avon canal, 7 miles east of Devizes, 7 south-west of Marlborough; containing 1,053 acres of land, and a population of 175. The living is a rectory, value £230, with 40 acres of glebe land, in the gift of New College, Oxford. The incumbent is the Rev. David Williams, B.C.L.; the Rev. Charles Dundas Everett, M.A., is the curate. The church, repaired in 1842, is a small and ancient structure, having a nave, chancel, but no tower; there are 2 bells. Here is a Parochial school. The Lordship of the manor is vested in the authorities of New College, Oxon.
