Alvediston

Committed to Fisherton Gaol

1810

A few days since was committed to Fisherton Gaol, by the Magistrates acting for the Hindon division, T. Stingeman, labourer, charged on the complaint of Mr. King, of Alvediston, with throwing away a certain quantity of corn which he was employed to thresh. Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 15 October 1810

1814

On Tuesday last was committed to Fisherton Gaol, John Loder, of Broad Chalke, charged, on the complaint of Mr. King, of Alvediston, with mixing certain ingredients amongst the food given to his horses, with intention to injure a valuable team which was entrusted to his care. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 7 November 1814**

1818

Cornelius Randall, late of Alvediston, cordwainer, charged with having, in the night of the 1st instant, broken open the shop of Robert Barnett, in the parish of Bower Chalk, and stolen there from a pair of boots, a pair of shoes, and other articles, his property. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 12 January 1818**

1837

Susannah and Sarah Roberts (mother and daughter), charged with stealing six gallons of potatoes, a quantity of fold-shores, and a turning stick, the property of John Wright, at Alvediston. Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 8 May 1837

Wm Lane, for stealing from the dwelling house of Nathaniel Philpot, a pair of boots, at Alvediston. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette Thursday 26 October 1837**

1844

Henry Stanley and William Moxam, of Alvediston, charged with attempting to commit a high misdemeanour. Salisbury and Winchester Journal Saturday 8 June 1844
