

Kellys Directory Extract 1867 Amesbury



Amesbury is a parish, formerly a market town, which gives name to a hundred and union in the Southern division of the county, Salisbury county court district, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and rural deanery of Amesbury, situated in a small valley, 8 miles north from Salisbury, and 88 miles from London. The church of St. Mary is an ancient structure, apparently Norman, with naïve, south aisle, chancel, organ, square central tower, 6 bells and a clock; it was extensively repaired about 1853. The register dates from 1654. The living is a perpetual curacy, yearly value £133, with residence, in the gift of the Dean and Canons of Windsor, and held by the Rev. Fulwar William Fowle, M.A., of Merton College, Oxford, prebendary of Sarum, rural dean, and rector of Allington. Here are National and Infant and two Endowed charity schools. Here is a Wesleyan meeting-house. The Amesbury Cemetery, containing an acre of ground, was laid out in 1860, at the sole expense of Sir Edmond Antrobus, Bart. The Workhouse for the Amesbury union is situated here; the union comprises the following places, viz.: Allington, Amesbury, Boscombe, Bulford, West Cholderton, Durnford, Durrington, Figheldean, Idmiston, Maddington, Milston, Newton Toney, Orcheston St. George, Orcheston St. Mary, Rollstone, Shrewton, Tlishead, Wilsford and Lake, Winterbourne Dauntsey, Winterbourne Earls, Winterbourne Gunner, Winterbourne Stoke, and Woodford. The river Avon here produces very fine trout. Fairs are held on the 17th May and the 8th of October. This was a Roman settlement, and its present name is by some derived from Aurelius Ambrosius, a king of the Romano-Britons. Vespasian's Camp is to the westward of the town and is intersected by the turnpike-road: it occupies the summit of an eminence on the banks of the Avon, and is surrounded by a single ditch and vallum, enclosing an area of 39 acres. The celebrated remains of a druidical temple, called Stonehenge, are situated on Salisbury Plain, 2 miles west of Amesbury, and within the parish. A nunnery was founded here by Queen Elfrida to expiate the murder of King Edward: it was once in such repute that Queen Eleanor, widow of King Henry III., retired to it, and there, in the year 1284, took the veil, as did also, subsequently, the Princess Mary, daughter of Edward I., carrying with her a train of thirteen noble young ladies. Amesbury Abbey, now occupied by Sir Edmond Antrobus, Bart., was once the residence of Gay's patrons the Duke and Duchess of Queensbury, and was built by Mr. Webb, son-in-law of Inigo Jones, on the site of the nunnery. Sir Edmond Antrobus, Bart., is lord of the manor, and principal landowner. The chief crops are barley, wheat, and oats. In 1861 the population was 1,138; the area is 6,000 acres.

Ratfin is one mile north-by-east. On the downs are various barrows.
