On Wednesday last was married, at Ansty, in this county, by the Rev. Mr. Hibberd, Mr. Joseph Green, of Ansty, to Miss Mary Green, of Bath. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 5 January 1818**

1822

Died On the 4th inst. at Ansty, in this county, in the 82nd year of her age, Mrs. Barbara Brawn; a woman in whom was combined the character of a good neighbour, a good Christian, and a sincere friend. It may be truly said that she died without having any enemy. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 25 February 1822**

1823

Married On Wednesday last, was married at Ansty, by the Rev. P. Bingham, Mr. William Edwards, of Fontmill Farm, in the county of Dorset, to Miss Jane Turner, youngest daughter of Mr. Henry Turner, of the former place. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 14 April 1823**

Married Monday was married at Swallowclift, in this county, by the Rev. M. Easton, Mr. James Cadley, of Ansty, to Mrs. Roberts, widow of the late Mr. John Roberts, of Child Okeford, Dorset. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 13 October 1823**

1825

Died On Monday last died at Ansty after a short illness in the 25th year of her age, Mrs. Elizabeth Parsons, wife of Mr. G. Parsons, of this city, and youngest daughter of Mr. Bowles of Ansty **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 25 October 1825**

1827

Died On Wednesday last died at Ansty, in the county of Wilts, after a long and protracted illness, which he bore with fortitude and resignation, Mr. Henry Turner, aged 70 years. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 12 November 1827**

1828

Married On Thursday the 31st ult. was married at Tisbury, by the Rev. Mr. Webber, Mr. George Oakley Lucas, to Miss Sarah King, of Ansty. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 11 August 1828**

1833

Died On Thursday last, in the prime of life, deeply lamented and respected, after a short but severe illness, aged 35, Mr. Henry King, an eminent agriculturist of Ansty, in this county. He was a young man of the strictest integrity, and his loss will be severely felt by a very numerous connexion of relatives and friends. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 23 September 1833**

Married On Thursday, Oct. 30 at Lower Donhead, Mr. Richard Kilsby, son of the late Mr. Kilsby, to Miss Woolridge, of Ansty. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 11 November 1833**

1835

Died, on Tuesday last, much respected, Mr. John Bowles, of Ansty, in this county. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 23 March 1835**

1837

Died On the 4th inst. aged 68 years, Mr. John Parsons, of Ansty, brother of Mr. Parsons, gun-maker, of this city. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 13 February 1837**

1841

Died November 23, at Ansty, near Wardour Castle, in his 97th year, Thomas Jerrett, who always went by the name of Thomas Tailor, or old Tommy Trap, the noted badger catcher. He boasted that he had caught 137 badgers in his lifetime. One of them, a young one, he bred up, and it became so tame that it would follow him like a dog. He was an earth stopper for nearly sixty years in Wardour Woods. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 04 January 1841**

Died April 1, Lucy, wife of Mr. Thomas Jeffery, Ansty, Wilts. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 5 April 1841**

Married At Ansty, near Hindon, on Thursday, May 27, by the Rev. D. Mead, John, eldest son of Mr. Wheaver, of Ansty, to Catherine, second daughter of the late Mr. John Parsons, of the same place. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 31 May 1841**

1842

Married April 26, at the Roman Catholic Chapel, Wardour, by the Rev. James Lawrence, Mr. John Barter, of Donhead St. Andrew, to Miriam, only daughter of Mr. Elijah Lever, of Ansty **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 9 May 1842**

1843

Died On Monday last, in her 65th year, after a long and protracted illness, borne with Christian fortitude and resignation, the beloved wife of Mr. William Turner, of Ansty Farm, Wilts. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 18 February 1843**

1845

Died Saturday last, March 8, Emma King, aged 37 years, the beloved wife of Samuel King, of Ansty, Wilts. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 15 March 1845**

Died, May 12, at Ansty, much respected, Jane, wife of Mr. William Everett, aged 70 years. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 24 May 1845**

Married At Ansty, Wilts, by the Rev. E. Dansey, Mr. Charles Roberts, Jnr. grocer, Shaftesbury, to Martha, eldest daughter of Mr. William Edwards, of Horwood. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 16 August 1845**

1846

Died On the 5th inst., at Ansty, Frederick George Augustus Parsons, aged 21. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 28 March 1846**

1847

Died January 3, at Ansty, in this county, aged 61 years, after a lingering illness, Mr. William Turner, deeply lamented by a large circle of relatives and friends. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 16 January 1847**

Married at Donhead St. Andrew, on Tuesday, July 5, by the Rev. William Dansey, Mr. William Turner, of Ansty Farm, Wilts, to Jane, fourth daughter of Mr. James Jeffery, of the Arundell Arms, Donhead. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 10 July 1847**
