

## Kellys Directory Extract 1867 Atworth (or Atford)



Atworth (or Atford) is a tithing in the parish, hundred and union of Bradford, Norther division of the county, Melksham county court district, diocese od Sarum, archdeaconry of Wilts, and rural deanery of Potterne, 4 miles north-east from Bradford, 3 miles south from Corsham station, 101 from London, 9 east from Bath, situated on the high road from London to Bath and Bristol. The church was rebuilt about 1828: the ancient square tower, containing 3 bells, once attached to the old church, now stands apart to the north of the present building. The register dates from 1653. For ecclesiastical purposes the chapelry is united to the adjoining chapelry of South Wraxall, together forming a separate ecclesiastical parish. The living is a vicarage, gross annual value £255, in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Bristol, and held by the Rev. William Laxton, M.A., of Trinity College, Oxford, who resides at Holt. There are several quarries of excellent stone in the neighborhood, well adapted for building purposes. Mrs. Jane Brown, widow, in the year 1706, devised £10 yearly to a master to educate poor children, £1 for books, £10 to the minister for catechising children, and £5for clothing the poor. Here is a small Independent chapel, a National and an Infant school. Lord Methuen is lord of the manor. The land is chiefly in wheat and pasture. The population in 1861 was 658.
