To the CLERK of the PEACE of the COUNTY of WILTS.

We, the undersigned Justices of the Peace acting in and for the county of Wilts, in pursuance if the provisions in the statute passed in the 9th year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the 4th, c.43, *do hereby certify and make known* to you, that according to our opinion, it would tend to the convenience of the inhabitants of the parish of BAVERSTOCK, in the said county, if such parish were annexed to and formed part of the DIVISION of SALISBURY and AMESBURY, instead if the Division of Hindon, of which at this time the said parish of Baverstock forms part. And we hereby require you to lay this out statement before the Justices of the Peace at their next General Quarter Sessions to be holden for the said county, in order that the same may be taken into consideration as directed by such statute.

And forasmuch as by such change, as well as by others already made in the said county, the labour of High Constables in executing their duties has been and may be further increased, application will be made to the court, if such alteration shall be ordered, to make such further order for remedying the inconvenience sustained by high constables by reason of such changes, as they are authorized and empowered to do, by the statute 10, Geo. 4 s. 46.
