Alfred was medically discharged on 31st December 1915; However records show that Alfred left Australia as part of the Australian Imperial Force on 24th August 1916 arriving at Plymouth on 11th October 1916. Alfred stated that he had never been regarded as unfit to serve when he enlisted for the 2nd time. Alfred was admitted to the Military Hospital, Fovant, on 13th December 1916. He was discharged on 1st January, 1917 after being treated for Eczema.
