



# Kellys Directory Extract 1889



## Baydon

BAYDON is a parish adjoining Berkshire, 9 miles northeast from Marlborough and 9 north-west from Hungerford, in the Eastern division of the county, hundred of Ramsbury, petty sessional division of Marlborough and Ramsbury, Hungerford union and county court district, rural deanery of Marlborough, archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury. The church of St. Nicholas is an old stone edifice in the Norman style, restored in 1857: it has a chancel, nave of two bays, aisles, embattled western tower, 3 bells and south porch: there are 150 sittings. The register dates from the year 1695. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £170, with residence, in the gift of the Baroness Burdett-Coutts and held since 1883 by the Rev. Henry Charles Cavan-Lambart M.A. of Trinity College, Dublin. The Wesleyans and Baptists have places of worship here. Williams' charity of £8 16s. 3d. arising from money left in 1850, is distributed yearly. The principal landowners are Francis James Simpkins, who is lord of the manor, Thomas Pearce-Brown esq., the Earl of Craven and Mr. William Tubb. The soil is loamy; subsoil, clay. The chief crops are oats, barley and roots. The area is 2,444 acres; rateable value, £2,752; the population in 1881 was 299.
