

Kellys Directory Extract 1915 Beechingstoke



BEECHINGSTOKE is a parish and village, 1 mile west from Patney station on the Great Western railway, 7 miles from Devizes and 78 from London, in the Eastern division of the county, Swanborough hundred, petty sessional division, union and county court district of Devizes, Avebury rural deanery (Cannings portion), archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury. The church of St Stephen is a small edifice of grey stone, in the Second Pointed of Decorated style, and consisting of chancel, nave, south porch and a small eastern gable pierced for 2 bells: the chancel contains a credence: the pulpit is of stone with marble shafts: the stained east window was erected by the Right Rev Edward Wyndham Tufnell, Bishop of Brisbane, 1859-75, and rector here 1846-57, to his mother and brother, and there are six other memorial windows, including one to the Rev Charles Mayo, ob. 1820, rector of this parish for 50 years: the church affords 110 sittings. The register dates from the year 1566. The living is a rectory, net income £199, including 32 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of Major Godfrey Clement Walker-Heneage, of Compton Bassett, and held since 1908 by the Rev Hugh Effingham Tilney-Bassett BA of St Catharine's College, Cambridge. The Mayo charity, of the annual value of £2 10s bequeathed by a former rector, originally provided clothing for the old, and bibles and prayer books for the young, if regular attendants at church; and there is another charity of about 24s yearly value for general charitable purposes. Here are the remains of an ancient entrenchment, inclosing about 30 acres. The Earl of Normanton, who is lord of the manor, Corpus Christi College, Oxford, and Edward McNiven esq. are the principal landowners. The soil and subsoil are green sand, with a little clay. The chief crops are wheat and barley. The area is 891 acres; rateable value, £1,694; the population in 1911 was 157.
