Off to the Front - Salisbury Reservists Leave the City

An Enthusiastic Send Off - Presents and Good Wishes

There was a scene in Salisbury on Monday morning not often witnessed in the city. Consequent upon the call of the 2nd Wilts Regiment for active service, the Reservists for that regiment from this district had to leave the city in order to rejoin their regiment at Devizes. Having gone through the necessary preliminaries there, they were to embark on Saturday for South Africa and form part of the Sixth Division Army Corps. It fell to the lot of the local volunteers to give these "Soldiers of the Queen" the last hospitality they could enjoy before leaving, and as a result of a movement by Captain MacGill, and other officers, some 36 Reservists were entertained to breakfast in the Orderly Rooms before entraining at 10.10 am.
