Bishop's Cannings

BISHOP'S CANNINGS is a populous parish, in the same hundred as the preceding places – the village is situated 3 miles N. from Devizes, on the road to Marlborough and Swindon. The parish church of Saint Mary is a large, and rather a handsome building, in the early style of English architecture: the living is a vicarage, in the peculiar jurisdiction and patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Salisbury. The parish contained, in 1841, 3,843 inhabitants.
