

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Blunsdon St. Andrew



BLUNSDON ST. ANDREW, a parish in the Hundred and Union of Highworth, North Wilts., and Cricklade parliamentary borough, distant 4 miles west from Highworth, $4\frac{1}{2}$ north from Swindon and 81 from London, contained. in 1851, 81 inhabitants, and 1,420 acres of land, the principal part of which belongs to Mrs. Elizabeth Tunstall Calley, who is lady of the many. The church is a small structure, with square tower, and contains 1 bell. The living is a rectory, in the gift of Mrs. Elizabeth Tunstall Calley, value £305 per annum, in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol; the incumbent is the Rev. William Thomas Wyld, M.A., who resides at Woodborough; and his curate, the Rev. Samuel F. Auchmuty, M.A.

HOLDCROFT, or Oldcroft, is a quarter of a mile south; Cold Harbour, half a mile south; Groundwell 1 mile south; Hide, 2 miles south-east; Castle Hill, Upper and Lower Bury, 1 mile south-east. Here is a camp. Tadpole Farm is in Blunsdon St. Andrew.
