

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Boyton with Corton



BOYTON on the River Wiley, in the Hundred of Heytesbury, Warminster Union, South Wilts, 3 miles south-east from Heytesbury, 7 south-east from Warminster, and 121 from London, contained 1n 1851, 393 inhabitants, with an area of 3,956 acres; rateable value, £2,683. The living is a rectory, value £549, in the archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury, and in the patronage of Magdalen College, Oxford. The Rev. William Aldrich, B.D., is the incumbent. The church of the Virgin Mary is a fine specimen of early English architecture, and consists of nave, chancel, north and south aisles. Rev. Arthur Fane, B.A., vicar of Warminster, is lord of the manor.

CORTON, or CORTINGTON, is a township, where there is a place of worship for Baptists, 1 mile north-west.
