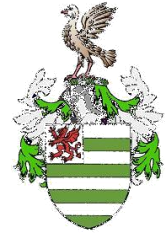




Post Office Directory Extract 1855

Bramshaw



BRAMSHAW is a village with BROOK and FRITHAM, partly in the Cawden Hundred, Wiltshire, and Redbridge Hundred, Romsey Division, New Forest Union, 6 miles west of Redbridge Station, 81 from London, 7 south-west of Romsey station. 5 north-west from Lyndhurst and 11 from Southampton. The population, in 1851, was 760; the principal part are engaged in agriculture. The number of acres is 3,560. The church, a small neat, edifice, situated in the northern extremity of the village, on an acclivity partially obscured with trees, is an ancient building, with a square brick tower, windows neatly glazed and painted, and mantled with ivy. The living is in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Salisbury; the incumbent is the Rev. Mark Cooper, A.M. There is a small Wesleyan chapel and a Baptist chapel; also a Free school. Sir Henry Poulett is lord of the manor.

FRITHAM is a hamlet in the Hampshire portion. BROOK lies to the south.

POST OFFICE - Mrs. Flora Henbest, receiver. Letters arrive from Lyndhurst ½ past 8 a.m.; dispatched ¼ before 6 p.m. The nearest money order office is at Lyndhurst.
