

Opening Of A New Wesleyan Chapel

A new and most commodious chapel, built at a cost of £300, which will accommodate about 150 persons, has been presented as a free-will offering to the Wesleyans of Bratton, by Mr Snelgrove. It was opened for Divine worship on Tuesday, when so large a congregation assembled from Warminster, Frome, Trowbridge, Westbury, &c., that it became necessary to hold a second service in the old chapel. The Rev. H Soper, of Salisbury, conducted the afternoon service and preached an excellent sermon. Tea was afterwards partaken of by upwards of 400 persons.
