Bratton



BRATTON is a township, ecclesiastical district, and chapelry in Westbury parish, Union and parliamentary borough, with a population of 721. It is 9 miles east-by-north of Westbury, and 111½ from London. Here is a chapel of ease, Baptist chapel, and National and British schools. The woollen manufacture is carried on; and there is an ironfoundry. GRANTS is 1 mile south; and SOUTH DOWN, 2 miles south-east.

POST OFFICE - Thomas Foyle, postmaster. Letters arrive at 8 a.m.; delivered at 9 a.m.; received until 10 minutes to 6 p.m. when they are dispatched through Westbury to Chippenham. The nearest money order office is at Westbury
