and interest of two tenement gardens and apartments there
unto belonging with two Cloves of land held by Copy
of Court Role under the King D^o Harky all in Studly
with my household goods implements of husbandry growing
Coops money by me or Dew to me or may hereafter become
Dew and all Debts and Funal Expensis to be Paide out
of my Property at the Discretion of my Executors
and Trust hereafter named it is my farther Will that
that the abov Property to be sold within one year after my
Disase and the Sum of Which to be divided Betwixt my
three Sons and three Daughters above mentioned Share and Share
alike

only my son Robert to be paid with a note of hand of Ten Pounds
lent him in money as Part of his share I likewise give to my
grandson William Newman the sum of twenty Pounds out of his
Mothers share I also give to my son William Henly all my
Wearing apparell I also give to my son John Henly six silver
Spoonns marked S H I likewise give to some Palmer of living
With me at the time of my Disease the sum of Four Pounds
and I do hereby Constatute and appoint Thomas Miles of Calne
and Richard Palmer of Scot Mill Studlar as trusts and Executors
of this my last Will and Testament and I do Disanoll all former
Wills beqanths made by me herebefore Disannulling Ratifying
and Confirming this and no other to be my last ^{Will} and Testament
Witness hearof I have hereunto set my hand this Twenty
Sixth Day of May one Thousand Eight Hundred and Twentyfour

Last Will & Testament of William Henly of Studley dated 1824

*Thomas Henry Hume Clerk Master of Arts
Treasurer of the Cathedral Church of Sarum
and Rector of the Rectory of Calne in the
County of Wilts and to his said Treasurership
united and annexed*

To our well-beloved, the Reverend *John Henry Hume
Samuel Satchell* and *William Strongy*
Clerks, **Errecting:** We do hereby authorize, impower, and give
Commission unto you, (in whom we perfectly confide,) jointly and
severally to administer the Oath under written, in manner and
form there set forth, to *Thomas Miles and Richard
Palmer*

*the joint Executors named in the last Will
and Testament of William Henly late of
Studley in the Parish of Calne in the County of
Wilts and an Hebraicall Jurisdiction aforesaid deceased,*
Requiring you duly to return these Presents to us or our lawful
Surrogate, or other competent Judge in this behalf, with the said
original Will annexed, and a Certificate, under the Hand of either
of you who shall duly execute this our Commission, **Testifying**
what you or either of you shall have done in the Premises, by
virtue of these Presents, on or before the last day of *January*
next ensuing, otherwise the same to be void and of none effect.
Dated at Sarum, under the Seal of our Office, the *thirteenth*
day of *November* — in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and twenty seven.

The FORM of the OATH to be administered to the said *Thomas Miles
and Richard Palmer* laying their Right Hands on the
Holy Gospels, is as follows:

You swear that the Contents of the Affidavit hereunto annexed, and to which you have
subscribed your Names are true, to the best of your Knowledge and Belief: And that the
Paper Writing, also hereunto annexed, doth in it contain the true original last Will and
Testament of *William Henly* — — — late of *Studley in the Parish of Calne*
in the County of *Wilts* — — — deceased, as far as you know or believe; that you are the
joint Executors therein named; that you will duly execute and perform the same,
and pay his Debts and Legacies, as far forth as his — Goods, Chattles, and Credits
will thereto extend, and the Law bind you; and that you will make or cause to be made a true
and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattles, and Credits of the said deceased,
which have or shall come to your Hands, Possession, or Knowledge, and exhibit the same into
the Registry of the *Treasurer of the Cathedral Church of Sarum*
and pass a just and true Account of your Executorship thereupon, when thereto lawfully
required. So help you God. [Kiss the Book.]
