




Tytherton Ride

From the Gloucestershire Chronicle 11th February 1837

DARING BURGLARY. - A daring burglary was committed on Friday night, in Dumb Post Inn, Bremhill, Wilts by three villains, disguised by crape tied round their faces. Miss Froyling, the landlord's daughter, hearing a noise, went on the staircase, and was knocked down three times, and left senseless. They succeeded in carrying off two boxes belonging to benefit societies containing 50/-.; and between 50/-. and 60/- belonging to the landlord. The boxes were found the next morning in a stone quarry, near the town.

Florentine Biscuits

In the Cookery section of the Village Show there is a class for making Florentine biscuits, considered to be one of the most delicious mouthfuls in the world! Here is just an example of a possible recipe, but, of course, you are encouraged to use your own.

Ingredients

- 25g butter
- 75g golden caster sugar
- 10g plain flour (plus extra for dusting)
- 65ml double cream
- 50g whole almonds, cut into thin slivers
- 50g ready-flaked almonds
- 50g whole candied peel, chopped
- 25g glacé cherries, chopped
- 25g angelica, finely chopped
- 175g dark chocolate (minimum 70% cocoa solids)

Pre-heat the oven to 190°C, gas mark 5

Method

Start by putting the butter together with the sugar and flour in a small, heavy-based saucepan over a very low heat, and keep stirring until the mixture has melted.

Gradually add the cream, stirring continuously to keep it smooth. Then add all the remaining ingredients, except the chocolate. Stir thoroughly again, remove the saucepan from the heat and put the mixture on one side to cool.

Place heaped teaspoonfuls of the mixture onto a baking sheet, spacing them about 2.5cm apart (to allow the mixture room to expand while baking).

Flatten each spoonful with the back of the spoon, then bake on a high shelf for about 10–12 minutes, or until golden. Then take them out of the oven and leave the biscuits to harden on the baking sheet for 2–3 minutes, before quickly removing them to a wire cooling tray to cool.


Repeat with a second batch if necessary.



Next, melt the chocolate in a basin over a saucepan of barely simmering water, making sure the base of the bowl doesn't touch the water. This will take about 5–10 minutes.

Place the cooled Florentines base-up on the wire rack and, using a teaspoon, coat the underside of each Florentine with warm melted chocolate. Then, just before it sets, make a patterned, wavy line on each one, using a fork.

Now leave the Florentines to cool completely before packing in airtight tins.

FIBRE INTERNET UPDATE

We are still trying to find answers to the many queries raised. Here is a summary of the information we have as of mid-March 2015:

Neighbourhood Plan: We are trying to build a map of advertised and actual connectivity in the Parish to inform the Neighbourhood Plan. We'd be very grateful if you could send the output from http://dslchecker.bt.com and http://www.speedtest.net/ as well as your telephone number and postcode to broadband@bremhillparish.org. We are aiming to build and maintain a map of these speeds across the Parish and publish it on www.bremhillparish.org. We will not publish the phone numbers but they will help us maintain the information.

Kellaways exchange (numbers starting 01249 740XXX): BT Openreach is still digging and making steady but slow progress according to Wiltshire Online. The re-forecast date for the Kellaways Exchange is April 2015. Continue checking http://dslchecker.bt.com. When an FTTC line appears in the output, you will be able to order FTTC from the ISP of your choice.

Bremhill: it appears that BT Openreach has enabled a number of additional cabinets connected to the Calne exchange. It seems that it is possible to order Fibre Internet for some phone numbers around Bremhill although BT Openreach engineers have struggled or been unable to install a functioning Fibre Internet service in some instances. Hence it is worth checking http://dslchecker.bt.com. If you can see an FTTC line, in the output, you can order FTTC from the ISP of your choice if you so wish but be prepared to be told that you are too far away from the cabinet to maintain a stable connection.

THE HAROLD FORD CUP

This cup is presented annually at Bremhill produce show, to the winner of the class for the tray of 5 varieties of mixed vegetables.

Harold George Ford was born in June 1909 at Queens Charlton, Keynsham and married Joyce (Cozens) in 1940. Son William arrived in 1944 and son Arthur was born in 1946. Harold bought Stanley Bridge Farm in 1956 and moved there from an estate farm known as Ford's Farm at Queens Charlton,

previously known as Off Licence Farm as it was licensed to sell Somerset cider. Harold remained farming at Stanley for the rest of his life until his death in March 1998.

During over 40 years living in Stanley, Harold was very keen on being an active member of the Bremhill community. He was a local parish councillor, being chairman of both the parish council and Bremhill village hall at one stage. He was also a keen vegetable grower as well as farmer.



As Harold and Joyce prepared to retire, they moved into a newly built bungalow near the farm in 1972 on Bencroft Hill. Son Arthur took over the running of the farm in 1982 when there were 70 Fresian cows to be looked after.

Harold so loved the Bremhill area and the farm that after his death in 1998 his ashes were scattered on the fields along with that year's supply of fertiliser. In his will, he bequested £1000 to St Martin's Church where there is a bench outside the Church and kneelers inside in his memory. This is in addition to the Harold Ford cup which is given for overall best tray of vegetables entered in the annual village produce show.

After her death in 2005, Joyce's ashes joined those of Harold when they were also scattered on the fields at Stanley Bridge Farm but this time without any additional fertiliser!






BOWOOD DOG SHOW AND SUMMER FAIR


