



Extracts from Broad Hinton Parish Register

1672

The Pulpit in Broad Hinton Church was erected new.

1682

A Silke purple plush cloath & cuishion for the pulpit with cost seaven pounds & nineteen shillings.

The Register of Hinton Magna als Brode Hinton began by Mr Henry Dudley, Vicar in the year of our Lord 1682.
Churchwardens: Thomas Littell & Richard Sadler.

1684

King Charles ye 2nd died February 6th 1684/5.

1688

King Wm. & Queen Mary came to the Throne February 13th 1688/9.

1716

Bought a new black heavye cloth marked with B. H. silver galoome with some other fancies. Cost -.

1716

The church was painted.

1717

John King, Parish Clerk

1718

John Brossier, Parish Clerk.

1756

Bought in the year 1756 a new Surplice which cost three guineas & three pence for eleven Ells of Holland at 5s 9d and Ell & half a guinea ye making £3 13s 9d.

1758

Planted a Mulberry Tree in ye Vicarage garden (which was sixteen yrs old when planted)

1765

Planted also another – southward in Vicarage garden.

1759

The Vicarage well cleaned November 20th 1759.
(by Willm. Rogers & Robt. Cole both go home were buried Feby 1761.

1760

The tower was new leaded, and a lock & key put on ye door; the key to be kept by ye Minister to prevent people cutting their name in ye lead.

1763

The two tables of the Commandments & Kings Arms were erected new in the year 1763 at the very earnest request of ye Minister.

1765

The Road pitched from ye Manour Gate to ye Pits December 1765.

1766

A new Communion Table Cloth & Napkin (Damask) October 18th 1766. Cost £2 1s 11½d.
Consecrated at ye Holy Table ye Xmas following.

1769

The Road from Isaac Pickets house to ye Church Yard was new pitched & 12 posts erected in December 1769.

1769

Planted eleven Spruce firs in ye Court before ye house & 14 others in Garden, Mick^s. 1769
Bought another which cost £4 15s 5d, at end of this book ye bill.

1770

A new Rope 11s 8d. A new Well Drock 14s 0d

1770

Planted ten before the house in ye Church Yd & 38 in ye fields, Mick^s. 1770.
Planted seventy Scot Fir trees in ye Vicarage meadows, Mick^s. 1770.
