

Swindon & District Directory Extract 1928 Broad Hinton



This is a village in the Devizes Division of Wilts, Petty Sessional Division , Union and County Court Division of Marlborough, and Diocese of Salisbury, and is 4 miles from Wootton Bassett, 8 from Marlborough, and 7 from Swindon. The Church is dedicated to St. Peter ad Vincula, the parish register dating from 1604. The living, a vicarage of the net yearly value of £200, commuted tithe, with house, is in the patronage of the Master of St. Nicolas Hospital, Salisbury. Mr. John Hussey, Mr. R. W. Horton, Mr. Francis Bailey, Messrs. F . Horton & Sons are the chief landowners. Area, 3,114 acres; rateable value, £1,473; population in 1921, 328. There are excellent schools, connected with which are a free library and museum, and also a recreation hall. Letters arrive from Swindon, and are despatched at 9.25 a.m. and 6.20 p.m. Weekdays. The pillar box is cleared at 6.15 p.m. on weekdays, and at 6 p.m. on Sundays. There is a Money Order Office and Telegraph Department at the Postal Telegraph Office.
