



Bath Cyclists Sixty Miles Trip Into Wiltshire

On Sunday the local section of the Cyclists' Touring Club visited Knook, and ten members, led by Mr. Woodcock, followed the Warminster road to the viaduct and climbed Limpley Stoke Hill. Continuing past Hinton Abbey to Woolverton, they took to the laneways which led them in a series of ups and downs to Rudge and passing alongside Brokerswood reached Westbury Leigh.

Their way then led them along the foot of the Downs to Warminster and a little later they reached Heytesbury for lunch. In the afternoon they continued along the Salisbury road as far as Codford and then turned northwards across the bleak and windy plain to Chitterne St. Mary. A few miles beyond Chitterne an unwelcome storm caused them to don capes and they descended swiftly into Tilshead and then made their way to West Lavington, where 15 members had tea.

The evening ride led the riders through Worton to Seend and, joining the main road, they returned through Melksham, reaching Bath after a 60 mile journey.
