

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Bulford



BULFORD, a township, parish and village on the banks of the Avon, 1½ miles from Amesbury north-east, 9 from Salisbury north, and 104 from London, in the Hundred and Union of Amesbury, South Wilts. The living is a perpetual curacy and peculiar stipend, present value £85, in the gift of Anthony Southby, Esq.; the Rev. Thomas Darnton Millner, LL.B., is the incumbent. The church, dedicated to St. John, is an ancient structure in the early English style, consisting of a chancel, nave, and north transept, with a Free school attached. Here is a chapel for Independents, and a Free school. Here is a paper-mill on the stream. In 1851 the population was 408; the acreage, 3,474. Anthony Southby, Esq., is lord of the manor.
