Sarah Comfort Webb v Edgar Weston

Sarah Comfort Webb sworn says. I was delivered of a bastard child on the 26th of January last, the defendant Edgar Weston is the father of such child. I am living at Calne and am a spinster. I was living at W. Kings the surgeon at Cane last January twelvemonth. I kept company with the defendant. I told of my being in the family way - he promised me marriage both before and after the birth of the child. I produce a letter from the defendant wherein he promises me marriage [Letter read by the Chairman]. I am not of Calne I came from Chirton. The defendant has given me one pound before the birth of the child and one pound five afterwards.

The defendant admitted the paternity and then said I have given the complainant £2. 5. 0. During her confinement and some other things which need not be mentioned, the most I can earn per week is 12 shillings.
