

Bastardy Examination

Calne

At Calne Town Hall 21st August 1854 Magdalene Hopkins v Robert Besent

Magdalene Hopkins swore & saith:-

I am a single woman in the Union House. I was confined in the Union House on the 11th June last with a male child. I charge Robert Besent with being the father of the child. I have had three other children also of the defendant. I have known him for about 7 years. One of the children is dead and the second died 3 years ago last ... About 10 or 11 weeks ago I went into the Union House and up to that time I received aid from the defendant.

The defendant declined to ask complainant any questions but admitted being the father of the child.

Ordered to pay 5 shillings a week for the first 6 weeks and 2 shillings and 6 pence a week afterwards and 12 shillings and 6 pence costs

6 weeks at 5/- is £1.10.0 3 weeks at 2/6 is 7s 6d. Costs 12s 6d. 50 shillings £2.10.0 all paid.

At Calne Town Hall 25th September 1854

Edwin Richmond swore & proved leaving summons at the house of defendant's father.

Magdalene Hopkins swore & saith:-

I am a single woman living in lodgings in Calne. I charge the defendant Robert Besent with being the father of an illegitimate child born on 15th April 1848, it was a girl. He has given me money towards the support of the child before it was 12 months old and since.

Adjourned to next meeting in order to summon a witness to give corroborated evidence.

Magdalene Hopkins swore & saith:-

I am a single woman living in lodgings at Calne. I was confined with an illegitimate child a boy on the 19th of June 1851. I charge the defendant Robert Besent with being the father of that child. He gave me money towards the support of this child before it was 12 month old and since.

Adjourned to the next meeting for corroboration evidence in the former case - to next Wednesday week the 4th December

At Calne Town Hall 18th February 1861

Magdalen Hopkins swore & saith:-

My child in 9 years old last June he was born on the 19th of that month. Robert Besent who is now present is the father of such child. I swore this child to the defendant but the case was not settled. Defendant has supported this child, he gave me money at different times within twelve months next after its birth for its support. I was then living with my father.

Owing to the non-appearance of witness case adjourned.

A case for a second child born in June 1858 was also heard and adjourned for the non-appearance of a witness.

At Calne Town Hall 18th March 1861

At this hearing the two cases heard on the 18th February 1861 were dismissed
