

Pigots Directory Extract 1803 Calne



Calne:- is a market and Borough town, in an extensive parish and hundred of its name; 88 miles from London and 16 from Marsfield, 8 from Devizes, and 6 from Chippenham; situate on the river Marden or Calne, and upon a branch of the Wilts and Berks canal. The town is in general well-built and clean, and for many years was a most thriving place in the clothing-trade; but like other towns in the west of England connected with the woolen manufacture, its commerce has received a severe check, and at present but little business is doing. This town returns two members to parliament: which privilege was conferred by Edward I. in the 23d of his reign, and the right of election vested in the ancient burgesses of the borough only, in number about 34; the two guild-stewards, who are elected annually from amongst the burgesses, are the returning officers; the present representatives are Sir James Macdonald, Bart., and Thomas Babington Macaulay, Esq. The Marquis of Lansdowne (a great patron of the town) is lord of the manor, and holds courts leet and baron occasionally; and a court of requests is holden every six weeks, for pleas of debt under 40s

The edifice for divine worship in Calne are, the parish church, chapels for Methodist, Baptist and Unitarian congregations, and a friends' meeting-house. The Church which is dedicated to St. Mark, is a considerable ornament to the town, and duly appreciated as such, being kept clean and in an excellent state of repair: it exhibits two orders of architecture, Gothic and Norman; and the tower is a very fine structure containing a set of chimes, and a ring of eight well-toned bells. The living is a vicarage, in the gift of the treasurer for the time being of Salisbury Cathedral; the Rev. John Henry Hume is the present vicar, and his curate is the Rev. Samuel Satchwill. The principal charities in Calne are, its free grammar-school, founded in 1660, for 30 boys, with exhibitions to the Universities; two schools upon the national system, supported by voluntary contributions; and alms houses, erected and endowed by Dr. John Tounson in 1682. The principal seats in the vicinity are 'Bowood-park,' belonging to the Marquis of Lansdowne, and 'Compton-house,' the residence of G.H. Walker Heneage, Esq.

The market is held on Tuesday; and the fairs on the 6th May and 29th September, for cattle, sheep, pigs, etc. The population of the borough and parish of Calne, by the last official returns amounted to 4,612 persons.

To LONDON, the Royal Mail (from Bristol) calls at the Borough Arms, every evening at nine – *the Monarch* every evening at ten – *the Old Company's Coach*, calls at the *Lansdowne Arms*, every morning at a quarter before eleven-the *New Company's Day Coach*, every morning at ten-*the Regulator*, every morning at half-past-ten-the *new Company's Night Coach* every evening at six-*the Regent*, calls at the *White Hart*, every evening (Sunday excepted) at half-past seven, -and the *YorkHouse Coach* (from Bath) every morning at nine; all go through Marlborough and Reading.

To BATH, a Post Coach from the Lansdowne Atms, every morning (Sunday excepted) at eight; goes thro' Corsham
