



# Post Office Directory Extract 1875

## Calne



**Calne** is a small and very ancient parliamentary and municipal borough, market and union town, and terminus of a branch railway from Chippenham, opened 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 1863, and large parish in the Northern division of the county, hundred and petty sessional division of Calne, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts, and rural deanery of Avebury.

The town is most delightfully situated, surrounded by hill and dale, upon the old road to Bath and Bristol, 88 miles from London by road, and 100 by railway, 19 east from Bath, 30 north from Salisbury, 8 from Devizes and 6 east from Chippenham. The town consists principally of one long street, with a few smaller ones branching from it; it is lighted by gas, and partially paved, governed by a mayor, four aldermen, and twelve councillors; it is under a local board of health. Petty sessions are held here the third Monday in the month in the Town Hall. Calne parliamentary borough includes the parish of Calne, and parts of Blackland and Calstone; it formerly returned two members, but now only one.

The houses are well built of stone, and have generally a modern appearance. In the vicinity of Calne a spot is pointed out as having been a Roman station. In the neighbourhood a number of springs gush forth, sufficient in their united strength to turn several corn mills, and which, with other streams, constitute the head of the Calne or Marden, which flows through the centre of this town on its way to join the Avon near Chippenham.

The church of St Mark stands in the middle of the town; it is a large edifice, externally of the Third-Pointed style, internally partly Norman, partly Third-Pointed, and partly renaissance; it has been restored and partly rebuilt, under the direction of Mr. Slater; it has a beautiful pulpit, and several windows of stained glass; it has sittings for about 1,000. The register dates from 1529. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £990, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held by the Rev John Duncan, M.A., of Aberdeen University.

Holy Trinity chapel of ease was erected principally at the expense of the late vicar, the Rev. J Guthrie; a cemetery is attached. The Free Church, Church Street, erected at a cost of £6,000, seats 400 people.

Here are Infant, National, and Sunday schools, all under Government inspection; also a middle school, endowed by John Bentley, which has been rebuilt. Here is also a school, which was erected in 1854, for 100 children, at the expense of Mrs Guthrie.

The Wesleyan Methodists and Baptists have places of worship, and the Society of Friends have a meeting-house here.

In this parish are several very excellent charities, amounting to £130 yearly, for general distribution; also almshouses for 12 persons.

One of the most important branches of trade in this town are the large establishments for curing bacon belonging to the Messrs Harris, who killed about £8,000 pigs during the last year. Here are two branch banks and a savings bank. Here are paper mills.

The market is on Wednesday; and the annual fairs are held May 6<sup>th</sup>, in the High street, and last Wednesday in September, on the Green.

A branch navigation from Calne unites the Wiltshire and Berkshire canal with that of the Kennet and Avon, opening a convenient and extensive water-carriage to every part of the country.

Here is a Servant's Training Institution, established by the late vicar and Mrs Guthrie in 1849, for the purpose of instructing young girls in the various duties necessary to make a good servant; £10 a year is paid for each girl admitted to be trained, and a considerable income is raised by work performed by the inmates, such as laundry work. The Children's Hospital is another instance of the interest which Mrs Guthrie took in administering to the wants of the poor of this parish.

In the town there is a Literary Institution and a Friendly Society, under the patronage of the Marquis of Lansdowne.

The Union House, a handsome building in the Italian style, has been built at Northfield at a cost of about £5,000. The union comprises the following places:

The Marquis of Lansdowne is lord of the manor. The principal landowners are the Marquis of Lansdowne, William Henry Poynder, esq., and Lord Crewe.

The soil is chiefly sandy, except in the valleys, which dip into the Oxford clay.

The parish of Calne occupies a part of the middle oolite series of rocks, and contains all the members of that geological division—coral rag, coarse sandstone, alternating with beds of clay and sand. The lower green sand and Kimmeridge clay are found on the eastern side of the parish, immediately overlaying the middle oolite, the Portland beds being absent, and the chalk, in the extreme portion of the parish to the east. A bed of the coral rag containing a coarse kind of freestone is worked in the town, and affords a tolerable good building stone; this bed is famous for the remains of echinae and other fossils found in it. The land in the district is chiefly in pasture, but still not entirely so, there being a considerable portion of the sand soil under the plough. Wheat and beans are grown on the heavier portion, and barley and roots on the lighter. The Marquis of Lansdowne has a large tract let to the poor on the allotment system, which has proved a great boon to the working classes.

The area of the parish is 8,079 acres; rateable value, £25,348; and the population in 1871 was 5,236; the population of the municipal borough, 2,468; and of the parliamentary borough, 5,315.
