1801

Various robberies, mostly of provisions, have been committed in this neighbourhood within a few days past:- In the night of the 11th inst the pantry of J K Bracher, Esq, at Chicklade was plundered of two sides of bacon, two hams, onions and several other articles. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 20 April 1801**

1815

Whereas some person or persons did during the night of Friday the 17th inst enter the premises of Chicklade Farm, occupied by Mr William Harding, and steal from thence a number of live pheasants, among which was a white one and several ring necked:- I hereby give notice, that a reward of twenty pounds will be paid to any one who will give information of the offender or offenders, on conviction thereof. Signed, William Harding. Feb 24 1815 **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 27 February 1815**

1830

George Laycock, of Chicklade, was fully committed to Fisherton Gaol on Saturday, charged with stealing two geldings, the property of Charles Millett, of Chicklade, on the 14th June instant. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 28 June 1830**
