

Crime and Punishment Cricklade 1800-1849

1801

Various robberies, mostly of provisions, have been committed in this neighbourhood within a few days past:- In the night of the 11th inst the pantry of J K Bracher, Esq, at Chicklade was plundered of two sides of bacon, two hams, onions and several other articles.

1815

Whereas some person or persons did during the night of Friday the 17th inst enter the premises of Chicklade Farm, occupied by Mr William Harding, and steal from thence a number of live pheasants, among which was a white one and several ring necked:- I hereby give notice, that a reward of twenty pounds will be paid to any one who will give information of the offender or offenders, on conviction thereof. Signed, William Harding. Feb 24 1815
