On Thursday the 8th inst was married at Chicklade, in this county, by the Rev. John Still L.L.B., Rector of Chicklade, the Rev. W. W. Phelps, M.A. Fellow of Corpus Christi College Oxford, to Octavia, daughter of the Rev. John Thaine Frowd, Vicar of Kemble, in this county.

Married October 22 at Hackney, John Dyer, esq, of Chicklade Lodge, Wilts, to Sophia, daughter of the late Joseph Weedon, esq, of King's Square, Goswell Road, London.

Married at Chicklade, Wilts, H. M. Becker, Esq. Hon E.I.C.S., to Lydia Catherine, 2nd daughter of the late Rev. W. Head of Stone Eaton, Somerset.

Married - March 2 at Chicklade, Wilts, by the Rev. J. C. Faber, Mr Candy of Chicklade to Miss Knight of the same place.

Married - May 2 at Chicklade, Wilts by the Rev. J. C. Faber, rector of Chicklade, the Rev. F. A. L. Foster, eldest son of Frederick Foster, esq, of the Sale Priory, Lancashire, to Anne Hulbert, youngest daughter of the late Rev. William Reid.

DEATHS

A few days since died Mr John Harding jun, of Chicklade aged 24 years, son of Mr Harding of Hindon; he was a young man of most respectable character, and is greatly lamented by a numerous body of friends, particularly by an amiable widow, to whom he had been married only ten weeks.

On Thursday morning died, at her father's house at Norton Ferris, Somerset, after a long and severe illness, which she bore with the most patient resignation and fortitude, Mrs Lucy Harding, aged 23, widow of the late Mr John Harding of Chicklade in this county.

On Tuesday died, at Sidmouth, John Kellow Bracher, Esq, late of Chicklade in this county.

A few days since died at Chicklade, in this county, Mrs Jape, late of Keinton Magna, Dorsetshire.

A few days since died, at his lodgings in Taunton, in his 88th year, Major James Field, late of the 44th regiment, and some time resident at Chicklade, near Hindon, of which place he was a native.

(Hampshire Chronicle - 10 February, 1823)

On Tuesday last died, in the 74th year of his age, at Chicklade, in this county, greatly respected and much beloved in the neighbourhood, the Rev. John Thaine Frowd.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal - Monday 13 February, 1826)

Died in February last, at Cape Town, Cape of Good Hope, Mr Thomas Randall, formerly of Chicklade in this county.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal - Monday 12 March, 1832)

Died, on the 26th inst., at Chicklade Lodge, in this county, aged 63, Eliza, the beloved wife of John Dyer, Esq, late chief clerk of the Admiralty.

Died at Chicklade House, Wilts, Margaret, the youngest daughter of the late Rev. William Read, aged 11 years and a half.

Died - Jan 27 at Edinburgh, aged 36, Henry Anderson Dyer, esq, M.D., 3rd son of John Dyer, esq, of Chicklade Lodge, Wilts.

(Wiltshire Independent - Thursday 15 February, 1838)

Died on the 1st instant, the Rev. John Still, L.L.B., Prebendary of Salisbury, and upwards of 50 years Rector of Fonthill Gifford and of Chicklade, Wiltshire.

Died April 20 at Chicklade, Wilts, in her 7th year, Caroline Candy, daughter of Mr Holloway, Union Street, Bath. (Salisbury and Winchester Journal - Monday 29th April, 1839)

Died Oct 3 at Chicklade, aged 76, Mr John Budden Knight, late of Berwick Farm.

(Wiltshire Independent - Thursday 17 October, 1844)

Died Jan 16th at Chicklade, Ann relict of Mr John Budden Knight, Esq, aged 72 years.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal - Saturday 25 January, 1845)

Died at Chicklade, Wilts, after a long and painful illness, aged 59, Caroline the affectionate wife of Mr John Candy.

Died at Bath of influenza, aged 65, Elizabeth, daughter of the late Rev. J. Thaine Frowd of Chicklade in this county.

Died Feb. 6, at Chicklade House, Wilts, much respected, William Daw, Esq, MD aged 88.
