## Chicklade

Chicklade is a parish and village, distant 16 miles W. of Salisbury, and 1 N. of Hindon, 4 from Tisbury railway station and 5 from the Wiley station on the Great Western Railway, in Dunworth hundred, Hindon union, South Wilts.

The living is a rectory, with residence, value £205, in the gift of the Marquis of Bath; the incumbent is the Rev. John Cooke Faber, B.A.

The church is dedicated to All Saints, is a plain structure, without a chancel; it has a tower with 1 bell.

There is a School, chiefly supported by the rector.

The population in 1861 was 120, and the acreage, 1039.
