Chicklade

Chicklade is a village and parish, in the Southern division of the county, Dunworth hundred, Tisbury union, Shaftesbury county court district, Salisbury diocese and archdeaconry, and Chalke rural deanery, 16 miles west from Salisbury, and one mile north from Hindon.

The church of All Saints was rebuilt of stone in a plain style, in 1858; it is much like others in the neighbourhood and has a nave and chancel, and will seat 174 persons; it has a low square tower with 1 bell. The register dates from 1721. The living is a rectory, yearly value £205, with residence, in the gift of the Marquis of Bath, and held by the Rev. John Cooke Faber, B.A., of Christ Church, Oxford.

There is a School, chiefly supported by the rector.

Miss Candy is lady of the manor. The principal landowners are Miss Candy, Alfred Morrison, Esq., and Mrs Seymour.

The soil is chalky; subsoil, chalk and flint.

The population, in 1861, was 143.

The parish contains 1,039 acres, mostly arable land.
