## **1866**

Chicklade Farm: On Monday Messrs Godwin and Son sold by auction, on the premises, the whole of the live and dead stock. Farm implements &c, There was a very good attendance of gentlemen and agriculturists of the neighbourhood. The horses and sheep sold well, and on the whole it was a very satisfactory sale. Mr George Howard is leaving this farm, we understand, for the purpose of turning his attention to the letting out of steam thrashing machines, an undertaking in which we hope he will receive every encouragement. **Western Gazette Friday 12 October 1866**

## **1867**

Messrs Godwin and Son have been favoured with instructions to sell by auction at the Farm Yard near Mr Gattrell's at Chicklade, Wilts, on Monday May 13th 1867, the property of F G Griffiths Esq, having left Knoyle Down Farm. ## **1869**

The Manor of Chicklade with dwelling house, cottages and 300 acres of land, was sold at auction on Wednesday last week by Mr Bedford for £9000. The purchaser was Alfred Morrison, esq, of Fonthill **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette Thursday 1 July 1869**

## **1874**

The license of the Inn known as Chicklade Bottom was transferred to Richard S Gattrell. **Western Gazette Friday 24 July 1874**

## **1889**

Chicklade, Wilts about four miles from Tisbury Railway Station.
