

Effects of the Late Gale

A large elm tree, which had stood on a bank at Mr Hale's Nursery, near this town, was uprooted on Thursday, and fell across the turnpike road, impeding the traffic for a time. The Calne coach had to remain at the Pack Horse, and the passengers, parcels, &c., to be conveyed from the Railway Station in a fly. Several other trees were blown down in the neighbourhood. The river Avon was swollen on Sunday to an unusual height owing to the late rains. The meadows and gardens adjacent were completely inundated.
