SWANBOROUGH, ARTHUR JOHN - Private 9775 - 1st Battalion Gloucestershire Regiment - died 13th April 1915 at Chippenham Cottage Hospital of wounds received at Mons - age 21 - son of Arthur Henry and Ellen Swanborough of Englands, Wood Lane, Chippenham - Buried 15th April 1915 at Chippenham (London Road) Cemetery, Chippenham - Grave/Memorial Reference - 575. - Commemorated on the Chippenham Town War Memorial, Market Place, Chippenham; Commemorated on the Monkton Hill Wesleyan Methodist Church Sunday School Memorial, Chippenham; Commemorated on the St. Andrews Church Memorial, Chippenham - (Only in recent years has the CWGC placed a headstone on this formerly unmarked grave).

SWANBOROUGH, WILLIAM ARTHUR - Private 203632 - 1st/4th Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - died 7th November 1917 at Gaza - age 24 - born in Chippenham; enlisted at Chippenham; son of Joseph and Fanny Swanborough of 5 Lowden Road, Chippenham; husband of Hilda Nellie Swanborough of 17 Sladebrook, Bradford-on-Avon - Commemorated on the Chippenham Town War Memorial, Market Place, Chippenham; Commemorated on the Monkton Hill Wesleyan Methodist Church Sunday School Memorial, Chippenham; Commemorated in the Memorial Book, St. Paul's Church, Chippenham

SWAYNE, A. H. - 1914-1918 - Commemorated on the Chippenham Town War Memorial, Market Place, Chippenham - (There is no defining criteria to enable identification of this casualty within the Commonwealth Wart Grave Commission Registers).
