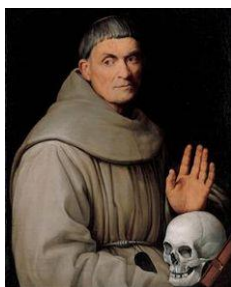


Income of the Living
