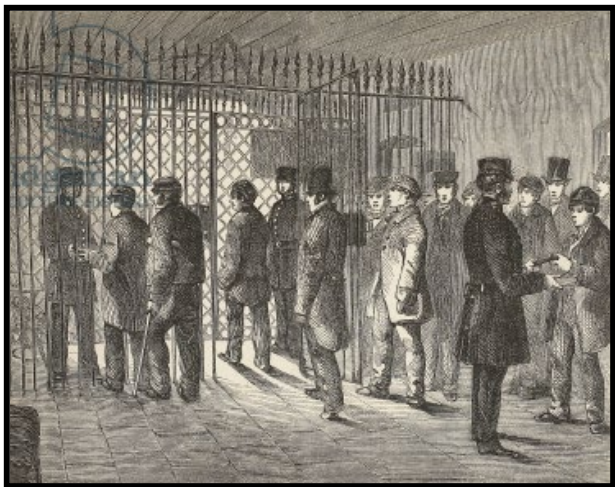

Chute 1850-1899



1860

Everley, Petty Sessions, August 31: (Before T.E. Fowle, Esq., E.D. Poore, Esq., and the Rev. J.H. Gale.) George Chowles, William Cotterall, and Benjamin Pettifett were charged with assaulting James Lucas, Police constable, at Chute, on the 4th of August. The case being a very gross one, Chowles and Cotterall were fined £4 each, and in default of payment were each committed to two months. Pettifett, who appeared not to have taken so active a part, was fined £1 and costs, in default a month's imprisonment **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 1 September 1860**or.

1867

Everley Petty Sessions Frederick Blackmore, of Ludgershall, was charged with trespassing in search of game on land the property of Mr. T. E. Fowle, at Chute, and the charge being proved, he was fined £1. and in default of payment he was sent to gaol for 21 days. Mr. Fowle left the Bench during the hearing of the case. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 2 March 1867**

1869

Pewsey Petty Sessions Mr. William Henry Sparks, of Ludgershall, baker, was summoned by Mr. Stretten, for selling bread from a cart, not being provided with correct beam and scales with proper weights, to weigh the same, at Chute on 11th October. Fined 50s. and costs 7s. Mr. Sparks was also summoned by the same officer, for selling bread otherwise than by weight, at the same time and place. Fined 40s. and costs 19s. 6d. William Kimber was also summoned by the same officer, for selling bread, otherwise than by weight, at the same time and place. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 18 November 1869**
