Andrew Anderson Wishart's birth was registered in 1896 to parents George Blyth Wishart & Agnes Helen Murray Wishart (nee Anderson). Andrew Anderson Wishart stated on his Attestation Papers that he was born on 9th July, 1895 at Wyndham, New Zealand.

Andrew stated he was a 20 year old, single, Sawmiller from North Arm, Stewards Island, New Zealand when he enlisted on 19th November, 1915 with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force. His service number was 8/4057 & his religion was Presbyterian. His next of kin was listed as his father – Mr George Wishart of Makarewa, Southland, New Zealand. At the time of enlisting, Andrew Wishart had been serving with Senior Cadets for 12 months. Pte Wishart was admitted to Hospital on 14th December, 1915 with Gonorrhoea while stationed at Trentham Camp. He was discharged on 12th January, 1916.

Private Wishart embarked with 11th Reinforcements Details (to make up shortages in 10th Reinforcements) Canterbury Infantry Battalion, C Company from Wellington, New Zealand on 1st April, 1916. Two ships embarked that day - HMNZT (49) *Maunganui & HMNZT* (50) *Tahiti carrying* a total of 2,222 men. He disembarked at Suez on 2nd May, 1916.

He embarked from Alexandria for Marseilles, France on 20th May, 1916. He was attached on strength at Etaples, France on 28th May, 1916 & joined his Battalion in the filed on 28th July, 1916.

Andrew was wounded in action on 27th September, 1916 (left thigh) & admitted to XV Corps Collecting Station on 28th September, 1916. He was then admitted to 36th Casualty Clearing Station & finally admitted to 8th General Hospital at Rouen on 28th September, 1916.

Private Andrew Anderson Wishart embarked for England on Hospital Ship *Panama* on 2nd October, 1916. He was admitted to No. 1 N.Z. General Hospital at Brockenhurst, Hampshire on 3rd October, 1916.

Andrew was attached on strength to Base Depot at Codford Army Camp, Wiltshire on 6th December, 1916.

He was admitted to No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford on 24th January, 1917 with Bronchitis (slight). He was transferred to the Venereal Section of the Hospital on 17th March, 1917 & then on 4th April transferred back to General Hospital with Pleurisy.

He was reported seriously ill on 9th May, 1917. His condition improved before being reported as dangerously ill with Jaundice on 22nd June, 1917. Pte Wishart was still dangerously ill on 1st July, 1917.

Private Andrew Anderson Wishart died on 10th July, 1917 at No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire of Atrophy of Liver.

A death was registered in the September quarter, 1917 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

He was buried at St. Mary's New Cemetery, Codford on 13th July, 1917.

Andrew was last attached to Otago Infantry Regiment, 1st Battalion. He had served in the

Private Andrew Anderson Wishart was entitled to British War Medal & Victory Medal as he had entered a Theatre of War – Western European 1916. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Pte Wishart's mother – Mrs A. Wishart of Makarewa (August, 1921 & March, 1922). Pte Andrew Wishart's father had died in 1918, aged 60 years.

The CWGC lists Private Andrew Anderson Wishart, 814057, as the son of George Blyth Wishart and Agnes H. M. Wishart of Makarewa, Invercargill.

A. A. Wishart is remembered on the Invercargill Cenotaph.


