PRIVATE A. HOLMES 23/2204

N.Z. MAORI BATTALION 28TH DECEMBER, 1917 Age 33

Commonwealth War Graves Headstone for Rifleman A. G. Glastonbury is located in Third Row (Left Hand Side) Grave Plot # 59 of Codford War Graves Cemetery (Using Map by Brian Marshall) (CWGC Reference - Grave # 102)

Arthur Holmes was born on 22nd June, 1884 at Auckland, New Zealand. He was a 32 year old, single, Labourer from Waiharara, Auckland, New Zealand when he enlisted on 15th December, 1915 with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force. His service number was 23/2204 & his religion was Church of England. His next of kin was listed as his sister - Mrs E. Dixon, c/- Mrs Stewart of 24 Nelson Street, Auckland, New Zealand.

Rifleman Arthur Holmes embarked with 5th Reinforcements, 1st Battalion, E Company of New Zealand Rifle Brigade from Wellington, New Zealand on 1st April, 1916. Two ships embarked that day with a total of 2,222 men – Maunganui (HMNZT 49) & Tahiti (HMNZT 50). He disembarked at Suez on 2nd May, 1916.

He embarked from Alexandria, Egypt for France on 27th May, 1916. He was attached to N.Z. G. B. D. at Etaples on 9th June, 1916.

Arthur was admitted to No. 24 General Hospital at Etaples on 13th June, 1916 & attached back to N.Z. G. B. D. on 17th June, 1916.

On 7th July Rifleman Holmes proceeded to join N.Z. D____ & was posted to N.Z. Pioneer Battalion In the Field on 8th July, 1916.

On 21st July Rifleman Holmes was evacuated sick to hospital & admitted to Field Ambulance. He was discharged to duty on 4th August, 1916 & re-joined his Unit in the field the same day.

Rifleman Holmes was evacuated sick to Hospital on 25th August, 1916 & discharged to his Unit on 30th August, 1916.

On 1st September, 1916 he was attached to Headquarters Command, N.Z. Division Train. He rejoined his Unit over 10 months later – on 21st July, 1917.

Private Holmes was evacuated sick to Hospital on 6th August, 1917 & discharged to his Unit on 11th August, 1916. He was evacuated sick to Hospital again on 16th August, 1917 & discharged to duty on 18th August, 1917.

Arthur proceeded on leave to UK on 21st November, 1917. He was admitted to 2nd New Zealand General Hospital at Walton, England on 7th December, 1917. He came "under surveillance for V.D." on 14th December, 1917. He was transferred to No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire on 16th December, 1917.

He was transferred from the "seriously ill" list to "dangerously ill" list.

Private Arthur Holmes died on 28th December, 1917 at No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire of Purulent Bronchitis.

A death for Arthur Holmes, aged 34, was registered in the December quarter, 1917 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

He was buried at St. Mary's New Cemetery, Codford on 31st December, 1917.and was last attached to New Zealand Pioneer Battalion.

He was entitled to British War Medal & Victory Medal as he had fought in Western European theatre of War from 1916 - 1917. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Mr William Marshall-Muir (half brother) of Maxwelltown, Wanganui. (both sent March, 1923).
