Charles John Harvey was born on 20th May, 1892 in New Zealand, the son of George & Eleanora Margaret Dora Harvey (nee Brunning). (His parents had both been born in New Zealand). He was a 24 year old, single, Labourer from Sandy Bay, Nelson, New Zealand when he enlisted on 19th October, 1916 with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force. His service number was 40212 & his religion was Church of England. His next of kin was listed as his father – George Harvey of Sandy Bay, Nelson, New Zealand. On his Attestation Papers, Charles Harvey left the name of his mother blank but he filled out that she had been born in New Zealand.

Pte Charles John Harvey was admitted to Hospital on 27th November, 1916 whilst at Trentham Camp, New Zealand suffering from Measles. He was discharged on 13th December, 1916.

Private Charles John Harvey embarked with 23rd Reinforcements, Canterbury Infantry Regiment, C Company from Wellington, New Zealand on HMNZT (80) *Corinthic* on 2nd April, 1917, destination England. He disembarked at Devonport, England on 10th June, 1917.

Private Charles John Harvey was marched in to Sling Army Camp, Wiltshire on 10th June, 1917. He left Sling Army Camp on 6th July, 1917 for France.

Pte Harvey was attached on Strength at Etaples, France on 9th July, 1917 & joined 2nd Battalion Canterbury Regiment on 25th July, 1917.

On 27th August, 1917 Pte Harvey was admitted to Hospital with influenza.

Pte Harvey embarked for England on 6th October, 1917 & was admitted to No. 2 New Zealand General Hospital at Walton, Surrey. He was transferred to Manor War Hospital at Epsom, Surrey on 16th October, 1917.

Pte Harvey was again transferred on 10th December, 1917 to New Zealand Convalescent Hospital at Hornchurch & again to New Zealand Fever Hospital at Tottenham on 30th December, 1917.

Pte Harvey was returned to New Zealand Convalescent Hospital at Hornchurch on 9th January, 1918.

Pte Harvey forfeited 3 days gross pay for being absent without leave from 9.30 p.m. to 10.15 p.m. on 23rd February, 1918 & breaking in & out of Hospital.

Pte Harvey was attached on strength to New Zealand Command Depot at Codford, Wiltshire on 4th April, 1918.

Pte Harvey was admitted to No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital on 21st April, 1918 with influenza.

Private Charles John Harvey died on 7th May, 1918 at No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire of Acute Nephritis.

A death for Charles J. Harvey, aged 26, was registered in the June quarter, 1918 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

Private Charles John Harvey was buried at St. Mary's Cemetery, Codford on 10th May, 1918 at 2.30 p.m.

Private Charles John Harvey, 40212 was last attached to 2nd Battalion, Canterbury Infantry Regiment.

Private Charles John Harvey was entitled to British War Medal & Victory Medal. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Pte Harvey's father – Mr G. Harvey of Sandy Bay, Nelson, New Zealand (June, 1921 & January, 1922)
