Daniel Hayes was born on 29<sup>th</sup> June, 1894 at Woodside, Taieri, Otago, New Zealand, the son of John & Annie Hayes. (His parents had both been born in Ireland).

Daniel Hayes was a 24 year old, single, Grocer's Assistant from Dunedin, New Zealand when he enlisted on 13<sup>rd</sup> May, 1917 for General Service. His religion was Roman Catholic. His next of kin was listed as his mother – Mrs A. Hayes of Outram, New Zealand (father deceased). On his Attestation Papers, Daniel Hayes stated that he was serving with B Company of the Coast Defence. He had suffered from Pleurisy & Pneumonia 13 months previous. Daniel Hayes was given a Pass (for Leave of Absence from 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 1917 until 21<sup>st</sup> August, 1917).

Private Daniel Hayes was promoted to Corporal on 2<sup>nd</sup> March, 1918 with A Company of 39<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements. He was promoted to Sergeant on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 1918 with A Company of 39<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements. Sergeant Daniel Hayes was altered to A Company of 38<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements on 27<sup>th</sup> April, 1918.

Daniel Hayes' Amended Attestation Papers for General Service with New Zealand Expeditionary Force was dated 10<sup>th</sup> May, 1918. He was a single, Grocer's Assistant from Outram, New Zealand. His service number was 63153. His next of kin was listed as his mother – Mrs A. Hayes of Outram, New Zealand (father deceased). Daniel Hayes stated on this Attestation Paper that he had previously been registered for compulsory military training at Dunedin.

Sergeant Daniel Hayes was transferred to 42<sup>nd</sup> Reinforcements on 28<sup>th</sup> May, 1918, He was allocated to A Company of 42<sup>nd</sup> Reinforcements on 16<sup>th</sup> June, 1918 & then transferred to A Company of 43<sup>rd</sup> Reinforcements on 9<sup>th</sup> July, 1918. Sergeant Daniel Hayes was promoted to C.S.M. (Company Sergeant Major) on 21<sup>st</sup> August, 1918.

Private Daniel Hayes embarked with 43<sup>rd</sup> Reinforcements, A Company from Wellington, New Zealand on HMNZT (111) *Matatua* on 2<sup>nd</sup> October, 1918. He disembarked at England.

C.S.M. Daniel Hayes was marched in & posted to 3<sup>rd</sup> Reserve Battalion Otago Regiment on 5<sup>th</sup> December, 1918 & his rank reverted to T/Sgt. On 17<sup>th</sup> December, 1918 T/Sgt. Hayes' rank relinquished to Private on arrival to U.K.

Private Daniel Hayes was admitted to No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire on 21<sup>st</sup> March, 1919 with Influenza. He was reported seriously ill with Broncho-Pneumonia on 26<sup>th</sup> March, 1919 & dangerously ill on 29<sup>th</sup> March, 1919.

Private Daniel Hayes died at 10.45 a.m. on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1919 at No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire of Broncho-Pneumonia.

A death for Daniel Hayes, aged 24, was registered in the June quarter, 1919 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

Private Daniel Hayes was buried at St. Mary's New Cemetery, Codford on 3<sup>rd</sup> April, 1919.

Private Daniel Hayes was entitled to British War Medal only as he had not entered a Theatre of War. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Pte Hayes' mother – Mrs A. Hayes of Outram, Otago (June, 1921 & January, 1922).

The CWGC lists Private Daniel Hayes, 63153, as the son of Ann Hayes of Outram, Dunedin and the late John Hayes.

Sergt. Major Daniel Hayes is remembered on the West Taieri War Memorial.
