Died – April 27, at her father's house, aged 33, Jane, wife of Thos. C. G. Newton, esq. of Lugward, Herefordshire, and eldest daughter of the Rev. J. Dampier, rector of Codford St. Peter, Wilts.

Died, Sept. 1, universally beloved and regretted, Harriet, wife of John Walter Lewis, Esq., at Foxdown, Somerset, and fifth daughter of the Rev. J. Dampier, Rector of Codford St. Peter, in this county.

Died, Oct. 27, at Codford St. Peter, the Rev. Charles Phelips, M.A., Rector of ST. Margaret Pattens and Gabriel, Fenchurch-street, London, aged 70 years.

Died, Nov. 28, after a most painful and lingering illness, Caroline, third daughter of the Rev. J. Dampier, Rector of Codford St. peter, in this county.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 7 December, 1835)

Died, on the 1<sup>st</sup> inst., at Codford St. Peter, Wilts, universally beloved and esteemed by all who knew him, Mr Thomas Bowditch, woolstapler, formerly of Taunton, Somerset.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 6 March, 1837)

Died – March 3, at Codford St. peter, Wilts, aged 31 years, much regretted by his family and friends, Mr Joseph Sturgiss, carpenter and builder.

(Wiltshire Independent - Thursday 15 March, 1838)

Died – Oct. 14, at Codford St. peter, Wilts, in the 76<sup>th</sup> year of his age, much respected and lamented, the Rev. John Dampier, M.A., many years Rector of that Parish, and of Langton Matravers, in the county of Dorset.

Died, Dec. 27, at Codford, in her 77<sup>th</sup> year, Mrs Hinwood, relict of Mr. C. Hinwood, of Codford St. Mary.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 4 January, 1841)

Died – Jan. 17, at Codford St. peter, Miss Crouch, in whom the poor have lost a kind friend.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 25 January, 1841)

Died, Sept. 1, in her 47<sup>th</sup> year, deeply and sincerely lamented, Dionisia, wife of Mr James Raxworthy, of Codford St. Peter, Wilts.

Died – Oct. 24, Mr Christopher Alford, of Codford St. Mary, Wilts, in his 82d year.
