

Harrod's Directory Extract 1865 Codford



Codford St. Mary – is a parish and railway station on the Wilts, Somerset and Weymouth line. It is in the hundred of Heytesbury and the union of Warminster, distant 14 miles N.W. from Salisbury, 4 miles S.E. from Heytesbury, 7 miles S.E. from Warminster, in the archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury, and in the rural deanery of Wylye.

On the summit of Codford Hill, in this parish, is Oldborough, a circle enclosing nine acres with a vallum and fosse. This earthwork was considered by Sir R. C. Hoare as superior to any other specimens of the kind he had seen.

The living is a rectory, yearly value £350, with residence, in the patronage of St. John Baptist's College, Oxford. The church was almost entirely rebuilt in 1844.

The Independents have a chapel, school, and minister's residence in this parish.

H. G. Biggs, Esq., of Stockton House, is lord of the manor.

The population in 1861 was 400; area in acres, nearly 2,000; rateable value, about £1,900.

The living is a rectory, annual value £440, with residence, in the patronage of Pembroke College, Oxford. The Rev. Henry Wightwick, M.A., is the incumbent.

Here is a National school.

The population in 1861 was 359; acreage, 1,611; rateable value, £2,413.

ISHERTON is a hamlet a quarter of a mile W.; ASHTON GIFFORD is a township, three quarters of a mile W.; adjoining is the Codford railway station.
