POSTAL TELEGRAPHS

To the Editor of the Salisbury and Winchester Journal.

DEAR SIR, - It may interest your readers to learn that the sub-offices of Amesbury and Dinton will be opened for the transaction of telegraph business in Monday the 1st of April; and that it is proposed to run a wire to the race stand before the next Salisbury meeting. This work will complete the telegraph arrangements for the Salisbury district.

Direct wires are now run from the Post-office, Salisbury, to the following places: London, Andover, Basingstoke, Sherborne, Exeter, Southampton, Bristol, Milborne Port, Mere, Gillingham, Shaftesbury, Wilton, Dinton, Tisbury, Hindon, Codford, Heytesbury, Warminster, Downton, Fordingbridge, Cranborne, and Amesbury. Also to the following railway stations: Salisbury, Wilton, Tisbury, Semley, Dowton, Fordingbridge and Verwood.

Taking the month of February, 1870, the first month the Post-office undertook the telegraph work, as compared with February, 1872, the messages passing through the Salisbury Post-office show an increase for the month of 2298. February is the lightest month of the year.
