Samuel Thomas was born 17th February, 1896 at Christchurch, New Zealand. He was a 20 year old, single, Teamster from Pukihinau, New Zealand when he enlisted on 30th May, 1916 with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force. His service number was 26207 & his religion was Church of England. His next of kin was listed as his father – Isaac Samuel Thomas of Mara, Rakanui, New Zealand.

Pte Samuel Thomas was admitted to hospital while at Trentham Camp in New Zealand from 11th May until 17th May, 1916 with influenza.

Rifleman Samuel Thomas embarked with New Zealand Rifle Brigade, 11th Reinforcements, 2nd Battalion, F Company from Wellington, New Zealand on HMNZT (64) *Devon* on 25th September, 1916, destination England. He disembarked at Devonport, England on 21st November, 1916.

Rifleman Samuel Thomas was admitted to Military Hospital at Devonport on arrival in England with influenza – slight. He was transferred to Base Depot at Codford, Wiltshire on 19th December, 1916.

Rifleman Thomas was marched into Sling Army Camp, Wiltshire on 15th January, 1917. He was admitted to No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford on 5th February, 1917 with influenza & then transferred to Convalescent Hospital at Hornchurch on 20th February, 1917. He was discharged from Hornchurch on 6th April, 1917 to report to Codford on 13th April, 1917.

Rifleman Thomas was marched back into Sling Army Camp, Wiltshire on 9^{th} June, 1917 & left for France on 6^{th} July, 1917.

Rifleman Thomas was marched into camp at Etaples, France on 10th July, 1917. He joined the Battalion & was posted to A Company in the Field at Rouen, France on 9th August, 1917.

Rifleman Samuel Thomas was reported wounded on 19th August, 1917 with a shrapnel wound to neck, jaw & right shoulder.

Rifleman Thomas was admitted to No. 3 New Zealand Field Ambulance on 19th August, 1917 then transferred to No. 2 Australian CCS on the same day. On 21st August, 1917 he was admitted to No. 14 General Hospital & invalided back to UK on 24th August, 1917.

Rifleman Samuel Thomas was admitted to No. 2 New Zealand General Hospital at Walton, England on 24th August, 1917 & then transferred to Convalescent Hospital at Hornchurch on 25th September, 1917 & discharged from there on 17th November, 1917 to report to Codford, Wiltshire on 3rd December, 1917.

Samuel Thomas married Gertrude Lillian Berry on 18th November, 1917 at Holy Trinity Church, in the district of West Ham, Essex.

Rifleman Samuel Thomas was admitted to No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford on 29th December, 1917 with broncho catarrh.

Rifleman Samuel Thomas died on 14th January, 1918 at No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire of ruptured abscess in throat.

A death for Samuel Thomas, aged 22, was registered in the March quarter, 1918 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

Rifleman Samuel Thomas was buried at St. Mary's Cemetery, Codford.

Rifleman Samuel Thomas, 26207 was last attached to New Zealand Rifle Brigade. He had served in the Western European War Front in 1917.

Rifleman Samuel Thomas was entitled to British War Medal & Victory Medal. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Rifleman Thomas' wife – Mrs S. Thomas of 49 Grosvenor Rd, Westminster, London, England.
