William Allen was born on 24th June, 1888 at Oxford, Canterbury, New Zealand, the son of Joseph & Leah Jane Allen (nee Twose). He was a 27 year old & 11 months, single, Labourer from Westland, West Coast, New Zealand when he enlisted on 25th July, 1916 with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force. His service number was 31453 & his religion was Baptist. His next of kin was listed as his brother – Leslie Allen, Oxford, Canterbury, New Zealand.

Pte William Allen embarked with 19th Reinforcements Canterbury Infantry Battalion - C Company from Wellington, New Zealand on HMNZT (69) *Tahiti* on 15th November, 1916, destination Devonport, England. He disembarked at Devonport on 29th January, 1917.

Pte William Allen was marched in to Sling Army Camp at Wiltshire, on 29th January, 1917.

Pte William Allen was admitted to 3rd New Zealand General Hospital at Codford on 19th February, 1917 with influenza. He was reported as "Dangerously III" on 21st February, 1917.

Pte William Allen died on 23rd February, 1917 at the 3rd New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire of Lobar Pneumonia.

A death for William Allen, aged 28, was registered in the March quarter, 1917 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

Private William Allen was buried at St. Mary's Cemetery, Codford on 27th February, 1917.

Pte William Allen, 31453 was last attached to Canterbury Regiment of New Zealand Expeditionary Force.

Private William Allen was entitled to British War Medal only as he had not entered a Theatre of War. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Private Allen's father – Mr Joseph Allen of Bexley, Oxford, Canterbury, New Zealand. (May, 1921 & January, 1922)
